From Our Rector, Father Bill Myrick:

Johnson's Baby Oil; I can smell it still. My youngest child will soon be 31 years old and that would have been the last time I would have come into contact with the iconic oil, and yet the smell hangs in my nostrils to this day. The smell has become so associated with babies and new life that one could say that Johnson and Johnson have captured the smell of birth in a bottle.

It is funny how smell works; it is often the sense of smell that triggers the salivary glands so that the back teeth are swimming in anticipation of something that has not yet arrived. In preparation for our first child, we painted walls, then decorated them with wallpaper borders. New furnishings filled the room with youthful colors and, you guessed it, new smells. That room and its smells proclaimed the coming birth.

Like our first child's bedroom, the Church is filled with new smells...new colors that testify to the celebration of new life that will happen April 24th. But unlike God who created for six days and then rested, creation never stops its prolific response to a God whose very breath is life. So also, this newly developed space, filled with new smells and colors, like creation itself, will once again resume its role as the birthing place of God's "new creation."

Our first Sunday in this new space will be the 10th of April. There will still be much to do, but every

parent knows that giving birth is never limited to the day the child arrives. Giving birth is a lifelong process of teaching and loving...lots of loving. In this way we become co-creators with God, a role God invites us to share in as He sends humankind forth from the garden with the words, "Be fruitful and multiply."



Being fruitful is the key to experiencing God's joy, and grace. All creation has been given the opportunity to "be fruitful" but only humans have been given the choice not to do so. But your efforts in preparing this space parallels the efforts of the gardener who prepares the soil at the base of the tree to encourage a more fruitful season.

Just as those who gathered our first parishioners a hundred and sixty seven years ago, we too "till the soil" for the birth of those we most likely will never know. Yet, just as the children of Abraham go about

blessing themselves in his name, so also generations will gather in this "birthing center" to experience the blessings you have shared with them. That is what it means to be an "Easter People." Alleluia! Even the very stones cry out, Alleluia! Happy Easter.

The Taizé service is based upon the Service of the Word with singing, silence, scripture and prayer. Taizé draws from contemplative roots where silence and reflection are central to worship and cyclical music allows the participants to center their thoughts on prayer. To the average worshipper fewer words and extended periods of silence may be at once disturbing and refreshing. Icons are sometimes used to provide a visual meditative setting, they are representation of events in the life of Christ and provide "windows to heaven".

April 13th: The Labyrinth Experience, taught by Tony Walter, using our new labyrinth! The Labyrinth represents a journey to our own center and back again out into the world. Labyrinths have long been used as meditation & prayer tools. Come, experience this form of prayer!

Paul the apostle. Paul the one untimely born. This is the story of Paul, a wretched man.

Most fiction authors must create colorful characters. This novel's protagonist comes ready-made with knotty complications and buffeted by conflict from all sides. It has been the author's task to allow the complex, critical, controversial man from Tarsus to bloom before the reader's eyes."

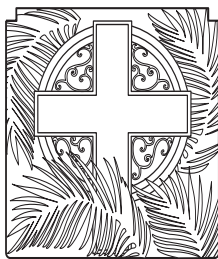

Alleluia! Christ is risen!

The Lord is risen indeed! Alleluia!!

Almost all of us can identify that there are 40 days of Lent (not counting the Sundays in Lent). Yet we are not a "Lenten people." We are an "Easter people" So do you know how many days of Easter there are?

Easter is more than just a day. It is a season in the church year as well. The Easter Season is 50 days long, and the last of those days is Pentecost (which is Greek for 'fiftieth'), marking the birth of the Church and the coming of the Holy Spirit with power.

This year, the Easter Season, or Great 50 Day Celebration begins on Easter Sunday, April 24th and ends on Pentecost (also known as Whitsunday), June 12th.

Following are some ways we can celebrate the season of Easter and the Resurrection in deed:

~ When we forgive others, feed the hungry, speak out about injustices, comfort the hurting, we are living the Resurrection... in deed!

~ When we share a joy-filled word of hope to a friend in need, we are living the Resurrection... in deed!

~ When we laugh with others, because we know Who has the last laugh, we are living the Resurrection...in deed!

~ When we take good care of our bodies, so that we are better able to serve others, we are living the Resurrection... in deed!

~ When we celebrate Easter and loudly proclaim "Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed!" remember the many resurrections in our everyday living. Resurrection indeed!

Live it! Celebrate it! In Deed!

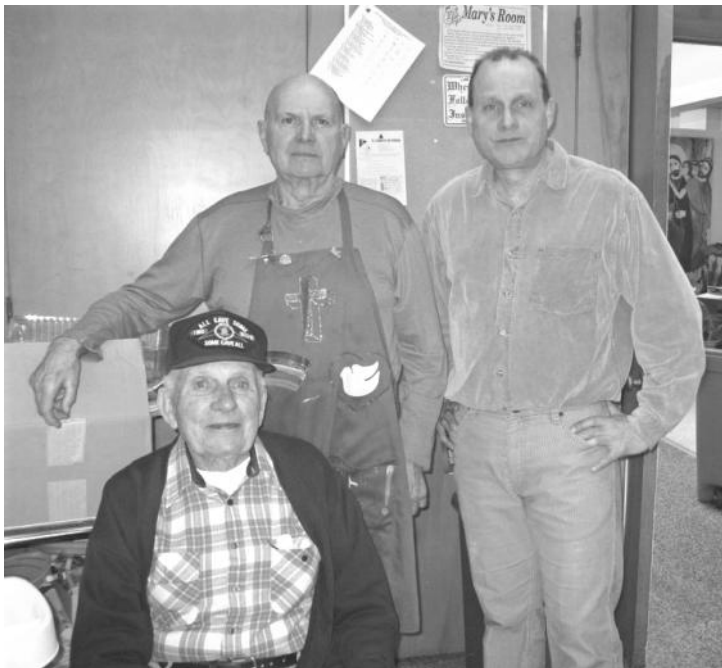

Vestry Snippets

The Vestry met on Tuesday, March 15th, starting with a devotion led by Steve Brown. Minutes and Treasurer's Reports from February were approved. (Copies can be found on the bulletin board or from any Vestry member.)

Also presented were the Building Expense reports from Treasurer, Roberta and CPA, Fr. Parks. The Vestry approved an additional \$60,000.00 last month, over the \$2,000,000.00 previous authorized. This amount may need to be increased due to more expenses coming in, and will be reviewed more next month by the Vestry.

In the absence of Building Committee Chair, Ken Oliak (who was out of town on vacation), items being dealt with in our Building renovation were presented and discussed via an email list from Pat Leverick. There are loose ends being tied up, more expenses as well that may bring our overages higher. It is hoped we can be in the Church for Palm Sunday services, or the week before, but we'll know more at a later date.

The Membership/Growth Committee report was handed out by Roberta, showing many events, services and more being planned in this coming year (see page 6 in this newsletter). We are also hoping to hear from other parishioners for more ideas and suggestions.

Barb Lonze presented the Outreach Committee report and recommendation of \$500 to go to Episcopal Relief & Development from undesignated outreach, along with the donations gathered at our Lenten Ingathering to be held on March 27th, to benefit Haiti's earthquake recovery efforts still going on. The Vestry approved this motion.

The Vestry members had current photos taken for the framed photo board to be hung in the Church for people to better know who their Vestry members are.

The next Vestry meeting, open to all, will be held on Tuesday, April 19th at 7 p.m., in the newly renovated Church.

Out of the Mouth of God's Kids

An army soldier on field exercises asked permission to attend church services on Palm Sunday at a small country church not far from the maneuvers. Given permission, the soldier entered the church quietly, wearing his leaf-and-branch camouflage. All eyes turned towards him when a small child cried out, "Look Mommy, somebody came as a palm!"

At an Easter Sunday service, the pastor asked the children, "What is different in Church today?" A five year old child looked up at the cross above the pastor's head and answered, "Someone left a towel on the cross!"

During Christmas we spent time looking at the Nativity scenes and telling the kids who everyone was in the manger and explaining it was the birth of Jesus. 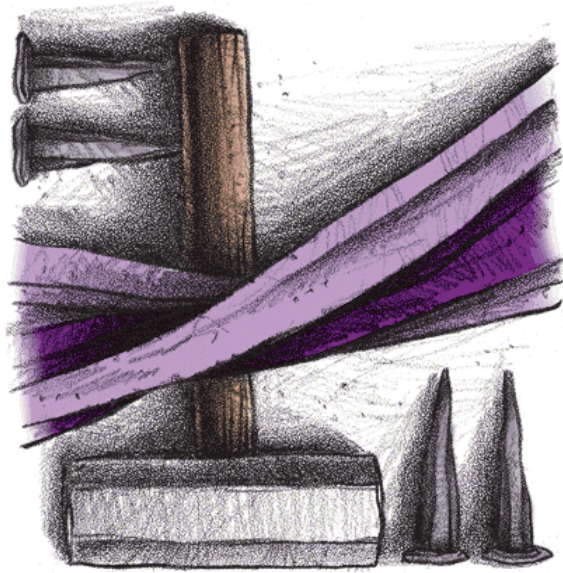


Last Sunday School Classes at the Temp. Site.
